March '07 Meeting Minutes Summary

At its March 20 meeting, the Greater Hansville Area Advisory Council (GHAAC) heard progress reports from four committees (Traffic Safety, Salt Water Parks, Energy, and Greater Hansville Sign), and established a new Senior Housing Committee to consider the need for assisted living units in the Greater Hansville Area (GHA). Dennis Cziske, member of the Ferry Traffic Committee briefed the group on proposed ferry fare increases. Several GHAAC representatives asked the group to address the problem of noise pollution from dirt bikes, illegal shooting and neglected pets, and the potential for groundwater pollution from the Eyers junkyard.

Lou Foritano, Kitsap County Planning Commissioner, briefed the group on the role and activities of the Planning Commission and reviewed the major issues it is now considering. Philip Fletcher, Planner III, Department of Community Development, provided advice on how to access information and personnel in his Department.

The GHAAC Interim Executive Committee reported that Kitsap County staff was conducting a final review of GHAAC by-laws, and that official recognition by County Commissioners would occur in the near future. Several GHAAC members volunteered to form a Nominating Committee which will propose candidates to stand in the election for the GHAAC's first Executive Committee.

In its April 24 meeting, the GHAAC discussed how it will prioritize objectives and activities identified in the Hansville Futures project, reviewed a map defining GHAAC neighborhood boundaries, and received a detailed brief from the Traffic Safety Committee on traffic calming devices planned for the Hansville and Shorewoods areas.

The GHAAC is working to implement the Action Items prioritized by the Futures process while also addressing issues which are developing between meetings. We are testing and developing our processes and organization to meet the challenges of implementing our goals and values for the Greater Hansville Area.
